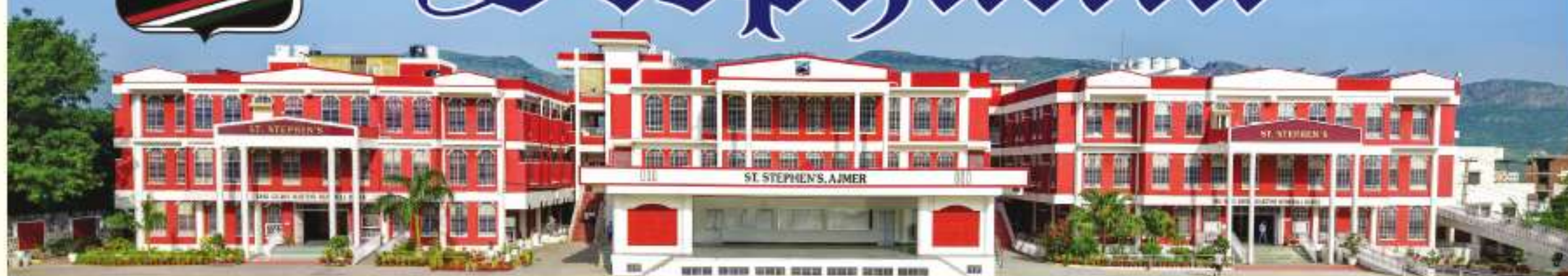

शब्द शाला और कबीर प्रोजेक्ट

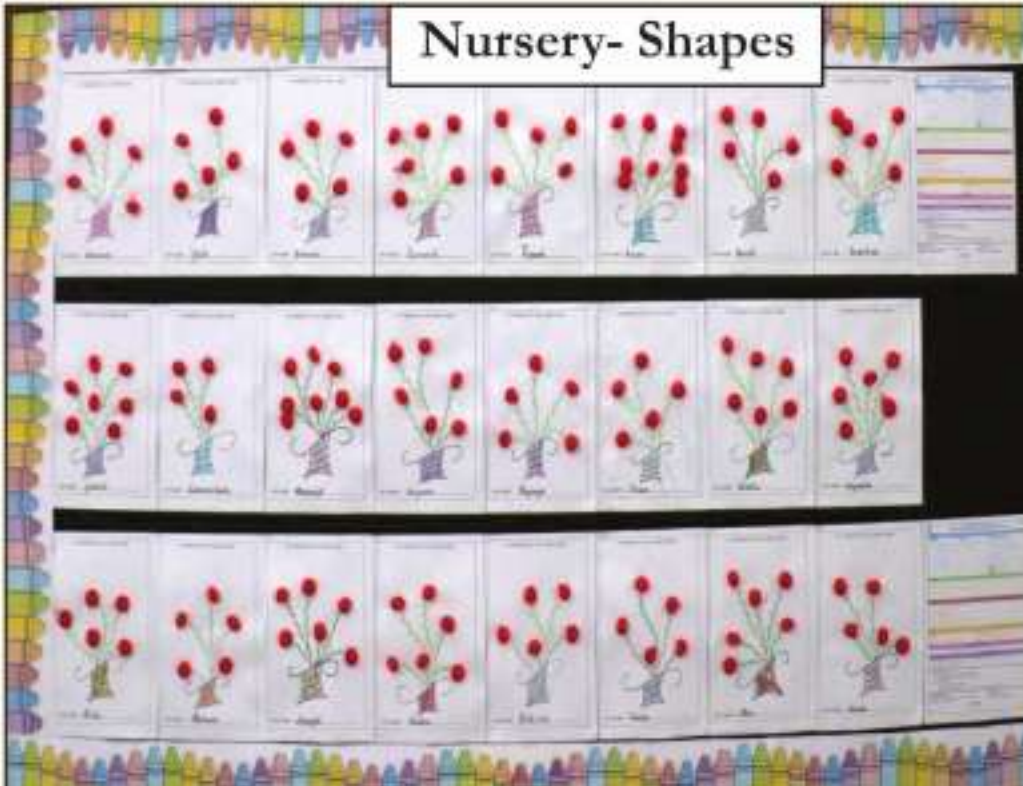
