





Some of the students even went to the famous Mudda market of Ajmer to learn the techniques used by the people making the muddas and also bought some of them.

With the encouragement of our teachers, not only us but everyone who took part in the exhibition, learnt about the rich culture of Ajmer and also enjoyed preparing and presenting the exhibition



#### **JOURNEY OF EXPLORATION**

e were very excited to work on the Science Exhibition and had been planning for it since a long time. We came up with the idea of a Hydraulic City. We were six students working on this project. It took us about 25 days to make the whole model. We devoted a good amount of time on this project. 
